## **May Demonstration Report**

Ulster Woodturners had their monthly demonstration on Saturday 14th May 2022 and enjoyed watching David O'Neill make a lamp. David used Walnut and Ash blanks for the lamp and started by putting a tenon on the base blank by using a sandpaper drive and the tailstock to hold the work. The sandpaper drive is a very simple tool and is easily made by flattening the face of an old chucking block and gluing sandpaper on. It gives a very positive bite to drive the blank safely. When cutting the tenon on the blank David used a skew that had been ground to match the angle of the jaws, giving a very good fit. When cutting the end-grain he used a shear cut to get the best quality finish.

After the tenon had been cut the blank was turned and a recess cut in the bottom with a bowl gouge and flattened with a skew. The bottom was finished at this stage and a hole drilled for the stem using an Axminster Excaliber bit, excellent for cutting into end-grain. The hole wasn't drilled the whole way through so that there was no tear-out, it would be finished when the blank was turned around again and held with the recess.

In order to set the thickness of the blank David used dog-leg or 'Jenny' calipers, drilled through the centre to finish the hole, and cut the blank to thickness cutting from the centre of the blank to the rim and finishing with a Phil Irons scraper. David pointed out the necessity to use a clean, smooth, tool rest to stop the tool skipping during the cut.

When the surface was ready David used a Paul Howard router jig and indexing plate to cut the flutes in the base <u>Paul Howard website</u>. The tools made a seemingly laborious looking job very efficient and gave an excellent result.

With the base flutes cut the tapered stem was formed with a tiny step in the base where it joins the base. This made a very attractive lamp.

David gave a couple of by-the-way tips... use a marking gauge to find the centre of stock because

it's faster than a pencil and ruler and make thin steel/aluminium templates to match chucking point tenons and recesses.

We thank David for his very informative and enjoyable demonstration.

- Two competition categories exist. All new members start in Catagory1 unless they elect to or are asked to compete in Catagory2 (because they have sufficient experience).
- Once a member wins Catagory1 three times they automatically compete in Catagory2.
